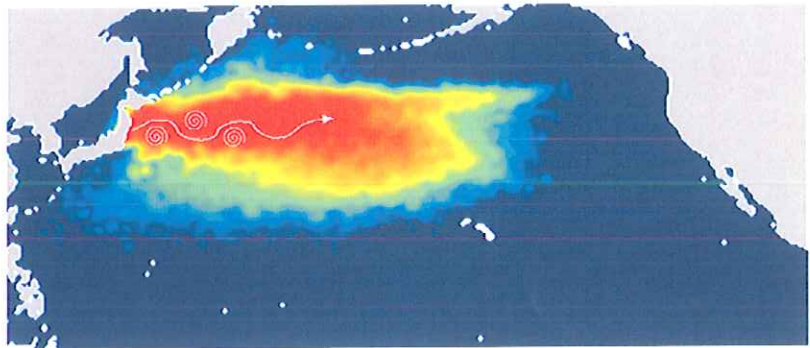


KELP WATCH 2014

Detecting the arrival of Fukushima radioisotopes to our coastal ecosystem.



The purpose is to monitor our California beds of *Macrocystis* and *Nereocystis* for Cs-134 and Cs-137, the major isotopes in seawater arriving from the damaged Fukushima reactor.

Volunteers are needed to collect 2 kg fresh wt. of surface canopy (~ 24 m frond length of *Macrocystis*) 3x a year, beginning early in 2014. Ideally the samples would be dried before shipment for further processing.
